1. Introduction

Come and See Rwanda (CASR) is a faith-based interdenominational organization committed to passionately preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and discipling individuals through biblical mentorship, while fostering holistic development that positively impacts both spiritual and physical well-being.

Our mission is fulfilled through strategic partnerships with local governments, churches, university and high school ministries, and the private sector. During the first term (January–March 2026), CASR focused on equipping leaders, evangelism, discipleship, and socio-economic transformation.

2. Core Ministry Focus Areas

CASR operates through the following key areas:

- **Uniting the Body of Christ:** Promoting unity among denominations to fulfill the Great Commission.
- **Equipping Student Ministries:** Raising spiritually grounded student leaders in high schools and universities.
- **Ministry to the Poor:** Supporting vulnerable communities through compassion and development programs (Socio-Economic transformation activities)
- **Enhancing Biblical Knowledge:** Providing theological training and biblical education.
- **Governmental Coordination:** Building bridges between church, government, and business leaders.
- **Ministry Venue:** Hosting and facilitating ministry activities at the Light House Ministry Center in Huye.

3. Key Activities and Achievements

A. Partnership with Local Churches (Leadership Equipping & Outreach)

1. Bible Training on Hermeneutics (19th–21st January 2026)

In partnership with Thompson Bible Institute, CASR conducted a three-day Bible training focused on hermeneutics. Participants, including pastors and university youth leaders, were equipped with accurate principles for interpreting Scripture. This training significantly improved Bible literacy and strengthened teaching capacity.

2. National Prayer Network Intercession (12th–13th February 2026)

CASR participated in a national intercessory prayer gathering at Apostolic Church Remera, bringing together over 200 pastors. This gathering emphasized unity in the Body of Christ and strengthened collective commitment to spreading the Gospel globally.

3. Training for Pastors' Wives (16th–17th February 2026)

In partnership with Missionary Marvis, CASR conducted a workshop on “The Role of Women in the Church and Raising Children with Godly Values.” The training empowered participants with practical knowledge and renewed their commitment to family and ministry.

4. Training for Single Mothers and Widows (19th–20th February 2026)

CASR organized faith-strengthening sessions focusing on perseverance during trials. Many participants were encouraged, spiritually uplifted, and restored in hope.

5. Pastoral Workshop – Southern Region (9th March 2026)

In partnership with Pastor Gary Bohanon, CASR hosted 25 pastors from Assemblies of God churches. The teaching focused on the Book of Philippians, encouraging faithfulness and perseverance in ministry.

6. Uganda Outreach Mission (March 2026)

CASR conducted an international outreach in partnership with Apologetics Uganda. Activities included:

- University and high school evangelism
- Church ministry across denominations
- Prison outreach (about 100 inmates gave their lives to Christ)
- Campus Night bringing together over 16 universities
- Discipleship sessions at Emmanuel discipleship Camp

Many people received Christ, and believers were strengthened in their faith.

7. Local Church Outreaches

CASR also conducted evangelistic outreaches in several local churches including EAR Gisanze, Assemblies of God, and EAR Nyanza, and more others impacting many lives through the Gospel.

B. Partnership with University Ministries

1. Apologetics Training (January 2026)

CASR partnered with Apologetics on Mission to train 180 university students from various institutions (University of Rwanda, Catholic University, Rwanda Polytechnic, and Protestant university of Rwanda). Students were equipped to defend their faith with clarity and confidence.

In partnership with the Forum of Evangelical Associations, CASR conducted a gospel crusade attended by thousands of students. Pastor Jackson Mugisha preached, leading to spiritual growth and transformation.
